 activities day to day.

- Supporting children with their classwork, reading, and writing skills.
- Supporting with behavior management
- Planning and leading targeted interventions to support pupils in development areas.
- Developing curricular knowledge as required by the school.
- Undertaking observations of pupils and contributing to pupil records.
- Supporting the class teacher with the general management and supervision of the classroom.
- Working in small groups or on a 1:1 basis with learners
